

Futuro Perfecto Continuo

Así se forma el presente perfecto en su forma afirmativa:

Sujeto + will + have + been + verbo principal acabado en -ing

• Afirmativa

forma completa

I	will have been working
You	will have been working
He / she / it	will have been working
We	will have been working
You	will have been working
They	will have been working

forma contraída

I'll have been working
you'll have been working
he/she/it'll have been working
we'll have been working
you'll have been working
they'll have been working

• Negación

forma completa

I	will not have been working
You	will not have been working
He / she / it	will not have been working
We	will not have been working
You	will not have been working
They	will not have been working

forma contraída

I	won't have been working
You	won't have been working
He / she / it	won't have been working
We	won't have been working
You	won't have been working
They	won't have been working

• Interrogación

Will I have been working?	Yes, I will	No, I won't
Will you have been working?	Yes, you will	No, you won't
Will he/she/it have been working?	Yes, he/she/it will	No, he/she/it won't
Will we have been working?	Yes, we will	No, we won't
Will you have been working?	Yes, you will	No, you won't
Will they have been working?	Yes, they will	No, they won't

- El futuro perfecto continuo se utiliza para expresar cuanto tiempo habrá durado una acción o situación cuando llegue cierto momento. Es necesario mencionar la duración de dicha acción (*one year, two days...*) y el momento futuro que se toma como referencia (*next summer, tomorrow...*)

- *Next year we'll have been living in this house for 2 years.*
- *He'll have been travelling around the world for one month on Monday.*
