

Phrasal Verbs 8

- set back	retrasar, entorpecer; costar (fam.) <i>The bus didn't arrive on time, so that set us back an hour.</i> <i>Her new flat is amazing, do you know how much it set her back?</i>
- show sb (a)round	enseñar una casa o lugar a alguien <i>Do you like my new flat? I'll show you (a) round.</i>
- show off	presumir, alardear, llamar la atención <i>He's always talking about how big his house is just to show off.</i>
- show sb out	acompañar a la puerta para despedirse <i>Do you have to go now? I'll show you out.</i>
- show up	llegar, aparecer <i>It's about time you showed up! We've been waiting for an hour.</i>
- show sb up	hacer algo mejor que otra persona haciéndola parecer inferior <i>Jim was so good at bowling that he showed us all up.</i>
- slip up	cometer un error <i>I slipped up and wrote 3 instead of 5.</i>
- stand down	renunciar a un puesto, dimitir <i>He should stand down as president of the company. He's useless.</i>
- stand for	representar; tolerar (a menudo en forma negativa) <i>UNO stands for United Nations Organization.</i> <i>I won't stand for that kind of behaviour.</i>
- stand in for sb	sustituir a alguien <i>I have to stand in for my colleague because she's got the flu.</i>
- stand out	destacar, sobresalir <i>She's so tall that she stands out wherever she goes.</i>
- stand up	levantarse (cuando se está sentado); dejar plantado, no acudir a una cita <i>I'm so tired I don't feel like standing up.</i> <i>He was supposed to meet her at 10 but he stood her up.</i>
- stay away from	mantenerse alejado <i>You'd better stay away from that area. It doesn't have a good reputation.</i>
- stay in	quedarse en casa <i>Do you prefer to stay in or would you rather go out?</i>
- stay out	salir por la noche <i>I'm very sleepy because I stayed out until late last night.</i>
- stay over	quedarse a dormir <i>You can stay over for the night if you like.</i>
- stay up	estar levantado, no irse a dormir <i>I stayed up until 3 o'clock watching that comedy.</i>
- stick by	ser fiel a; atenerse <i>I'll stick by him no matter what he's done.</i> <i>You must stick by your promise.</i>
- stick in	meter, introducir <i>Let's watch a film. Stick the dvd in.</i>
- stick out	sobresalir, resaltar; sacar (lengua, pecho) <i>You really stick out in that bright orange top.</i> <i>Don't stick out your tongue!</i>
- stick to	atenerse, ceñirse a <i>We don't have much time, so we'd better stick to our plan.</i>
- stick up	ponerse de punta (pelo) <i>Your hair is sticking up.</i>
- stick up for sb	defender a alguien (a menudo alguien a quien se está criticando) <i>Everybody criticises her for her clothes, but I'll always stick up for her.</i>
- stick up on	pegar, adherir <i>You're not allowed to stick posters up on the wall.</i>
